The Australian Women Donors Network, in association with Philanthropy Australia, is pleased to invite you to a special briefing for donors, trustees and grantmakers on the 2011 groundbreaking research into Australia's philanthropic investment in women and girls.

The research, ***Mapping Australia's Philanthropic Investment in Women and Girls*** is the first study of its kind undertaken in Australia.

Commissioned by the Australian Women Donors Network (Women Donors), and conducted by the Australian Centre for Philanthropy and Nonprofit studies (ACPNS) at Queensland University of Technology, the findings represent \$90 million of grantmaking across 100 donors and foundations.

Join us for a light luncheon as Senior Research Fellow Dr Wendy Scaife presents the key findings and insights into gender based giving in Australia.

Wendy studies and teaches philanthropy and fundraising. Her work spans the cause/giver spectrum (see http://eprints.qut.edu.au/view/person/Scaife_Wendy.html). Recent study areas include foundations, major gifts, bequests and funding for Indigenous need. Wendy was on the Research Australia Philanthropy and National Compact Steering Committees. She serves on Fundraising Institute of Australia's Codes Taskforce and Professional Development Committee.
